

BUSINESS RULES OF THE CONFERENCE.

I. Two sessions shall be held daily, as follows: From 8 to

11.30 A. M., and from 1 to 5 P. M.

2. The Chairman shall take his seat precisely at the time to which the Conference adjourned, open and conduct the devotional exercises. The Secretary shall call the roll, and read the minutes of the preceding session, after which business shall proceed as follows:

- 3. Anyone wishing to speak shall arise and respectfully address the Chair. In case more than one should address the Chair at the same time, the Chairman shall decide who is entitled to the floor.
- 4. No one shall be allowed to speak more than ten minutes on any subject unless he receives permission by the Chair.
- 5. No one shall speak the second time until all who desire have spoken. He shall then ask permission of the Chairman.

6. It shall be the duty of the Chairman to preserve order.

SPECIAL LAWS AND RESOLUTIONS.

We print here from the Records for convenient reference the following Laws and Resolutions, together with the time of their enactment:

I.—MEMBERS OF THE ANNUAL CONFERENCE.

A.—The following shall be the members of the Annual Conference.

(a) Ordained Ministers.

(b) Probationers who have charge.

(c) One Delegate from each charge, elected by ballot at the last Quarterly Conference in the Conference year. (Act of General Conference, 1892.)

(d) Each Quarterly Conference shall elect one Alternate Delegate to the Annual Conference. (Enacted March 7,

1898.)

(e) It is requested that all the members of the Annual Conference shall be present at each session. In case of absence they shall submit a written report and cause of absence. (Enacted February 3, 1892.)

(f) If a Delegate fails to be present at the beginning of the Annual Conference Session, except detained through sickness or accident, the Conference is not bound to recognize

him as a member. (Enacted February 3, 1894.)

(g) The Delegates from the Missions who expect support from the Conference shall not be members of the Stationing, Boundary and Appropriating Committee. (Enacted February 22, 1897.)

B.—Advisory Members.

The following shall be Advisory Members of the Annual Conference:

- (a) Annual Conference Licensed Evangelists and Missionaries.
 - (b) Quarterly Conference Licensed Missionaries.(c) Local Workers. [Enacted February 7, 1896.]

II.—APPLICANTS AND PROBATIONERS.

A.—No Applicants for the Ministry shall be received into the Conference as Probationers who are not willing to submit themselves unconditionally to the Stationing Committee. [Enacted February 3, 1890.] B.—All Applicants for the Ministry shall be examined by their respective Presiding Elders on our Articles of Faith and Church Discipline at the same time and place when the Probationers are examined on the Reading Course. [Enacted February 8, 1893.]

C.—No Probationer shall be ordained who is not fully in line with our doctrine, with the itinerant plan, and submission to the Conterence. [Enacted February 3, 1890.]

D.—No Probationer in the Ministry or in the office of Deacon shall be ordained who uses or deals in tobacco. They must use their influence against the same. [Enacted February 4, 1885.]

III.—READING COURSE.

A.—The Annual Lessons for each class shall be divided into two parts, and Probationers shall be examined semi-annually. [Enacted February 1, 1895.]

B.—Probationers shall be examined by a written examination by a committee to be appointed annually by the An-

nual Conference for this purpose.

They shall make 20 per cent. on each book, and an average of 40 per cent. on the whole, in order to pass. No probationer shall be ordained until he has passed the Reading Course. [Discipline, page 109.]

IV.—SPECIAL SERVICES.

A.—Matrimony,—Each Minister-in-charge shall preach a sermon on Matrimony at each appointment on his charge in the first year.

B.—Temperance.—Each Minister-in-charge shall preach a sermon on Temperance at least once a year at each appoint-

ment.

C.—Home Missions.—The Presiding Elder shall hold a Missionary meeting annually at every appointment with the assistance of the Minister-in-charge and take up a collection for the Home Missionary cause. [Discipline, page 84.]

D.—Foreign Missions, Harvest Home.—Each Minister-incharge shall continue to hold a Harvest Home Service at each appointment annually, and speak on Foreign Missionary Work. The Annual Foreign Missionary Offering shall be received on this occasion. [Enacted February 3, 1894.]

E.—Missionary Day.—The Minister-in-charge shall see that the Superintendent of each Sunday School appoint a "Missionary Day" annually. In this service the necessity of establishing and supporting Foreign Missions shall be im-

pressed upon the minds of the children, and a collection

taken up for the same. [Enacted February 3, 1894.]

F.—Charity.—The pastor, or somebody appointed by him, shall hold a Special Service in October, at each appointment. On this occasion the Annual Offering for the Poor shall be received. [Enacted February 20, 1897.]

G.—Missionary Presiding Elder.—Each class shall lift a free-will offering for the Missionary Presiding Elder every

quarter. [Enacted February 20, 1897.]

Gospel Workers.—A free-will offering shall be lifted for the Gospel Workers in each class at a monthly prayer meeting held by their respective class leaders. [Enacted Feb-

ruary 20, 1897.

H.—Collections.—The pastors shall have charge of the Offerings for the Poor, Foreign and Home Missionary Work, until the Annual Conference, unless needed sooner. The Offerings for the Missionary Presiding Elder and Gospel Workers shall be delivered to the Presiding Elder at the Quarterly Conference and reported by the pastor to the Annual Conference.

All moneys collected for charitable purposes, not paid over to the Treasurer of the Poor Fund, shall be included in the report of the Treasurer of the Board of Trustees. [Enacted February 20, 1897.]

I.—The Lord's Coming.—WHEREAS, We believe that the coming of the Lord is rapidly approaching; therefore

RESOLVED. That we recommend our Ministers to give still more earnest prominence to this blessed hope of the church, as we see the Day approaching. [Enacted February 4, 1894. Amended March 4, 1899.]

J.—Class Meetings.—The Minister-in-charge shall hold a class meeting four times a year in each class, and read the general rules or get them read once a year. [Discipline, page

80.

K.—Camp Meetings.—Camp meetings shall be held annually according to the decision of the Presiding Elder and

Pastors of their respective districts.

L.—Sunday School Conventions.—Each district shall hold a Sunday School convention annually. The Officers shall be elected at the Annual Conference.

V.—QUARTERLY CONFERENCE RULES.

A.—The Minister-in-charge shall see that the Annual Statistical Report be correctly compiled and appended to the proceedings of the last Quarterly Conference of the current

year, as follows:

(a) Report of Board of Trustees.

(b) Report of Stewards.

(c) Report of Presiding Elder's Collections. (d) Report of Sunday School Superintendent.

(e) Report of Home and Foreign Mission Collections.

(f) Report of Annual Election of Officers. [Enacted February 3, 1892.

B.—All officers of Quarterly Conference who are absent from Quarterly Conference shall submit a written report and a satisfactory excuse. Failing to do this, they shall appear before the next Quarterly Conference. If such are absent the second time without submitting a written report and statement of the cause of absence, they shall be removed from office. [Enacted February 3, 1894.]

C.-RESOLVED, That we will not permit any of our Ouarterly Conference License Workers to travel as Evangelists, except by permission of the Annual Conference. [En-

acted February 22, 1897.

D.—The classes shall elect no Ministers to any office.— Enacted February 3, 1894.

VI.—MISCELLANEOUS.

A.—Transfers.—When a good standing member moves from one class to another, his or her name shall be trans-

ferred at once. [Enacted February 3, 1894.]

B.—Camp Meetings.—The advisability of having boarding stands at the various camp meetings shall be left to the decisions of the Presiding Elders. Enacted September 17,

C .- Charges .- No charges shall be brought against any Annual Conference member which have not been recorded in the Quarterly Conference proceedings of their charge, except such as have been committed or discovered since the last Quarterly Conference. [Enacted February 2, 1891]

D.—No person shall be elected to the office of Deacon, Class Leader or Sunday School Superintendent who uses or

deals in tobacco. [Enacted February 20, 1897.]

E.—The expenses of any committee of investigation appointed by the Presiding Elder shall be presented to the Annual Conference and paid by the Ministers. [Enacted March 7, 1898.]

F.—A Board of Foreign Missions consisting of five shall be elected annually. The President shall call and preside over the meetings of the board held annually or oftener. The Secretary shall communicate with the Foreign Missionaries and report to the Annual Conference. The Treasurer shall report the financial standing of the board to the Annual Conference.

G.—Each Pastor shall bring an itemized report to the Conference, according to the form of the report of the Financial Secretary.

FIRST SESSION.

The Eighteenth Annual Conference of the Mennonite Brethren in Christ of the Pennsylvania District, convened in Ebenezer church, Bethlehem, Pa., at 8 A. M., October 4, 1901.

The first session was opened by the secretary, by singing

elected by ballot.

Elder W. B. Musselman was elected, whereupon he gave a very practical and encouraging address on Psalm 133, followed by a season of earnest prayer for the blessing of God and the guidance of the Holy Ghost during this conference session.

The reports were very encouraging. The work, in general, is in a prosperous condition, spiritually and financially. The Pastors have good courage.

A real missionary spirit is dominant in nearly all the

classes as proved by the sacrifice of the dear ones.

FOURTH SESSION, SATURDAY AFTERNOON, OCTOBER 5, 1901.

Opened by singing and prayer by W. Steinmetz, after which the minutes were read and received with corrections.

Committee on Resolutions:

(a) WHEREAS, The excuse received from Brother Herbert Shick, delegate from Erwinna, concerning his absence has not been deemed satisfactory, therefore,

RESOLVED, That this Conference is displeased with the

absence of said delegate.

(b) RESOLVED, That we would respectfully recommend the members of our church to encourage the Foreign Missionary Board in forwarding their funds through the aforesaid Board, and not to forward their money direct to the Missionaries, thereby lessening or neglecting their contributions in the direct channel, provided by Conference, for the support pledged to our respective Missionaries.

(c) WHEREAS, We have in the inspired record a number of instances where the children of Christian parents were formally and publicly dedicated to the Lord. I Sam. 22-28.

The Twelfth Annual Ministerial Convention of the Mennonite Brethren in Christ of the Pennsylvania Conference convened in Ebenezer Church, Laurel street, Bethlehem,

Pa., on October 3rd, 1901.

The Chairman, Elder R. L. Woodring, opened the Convention at 9 A. M. by singing, a few appropriate remarks on Psalm 46, and prayer, followed by the enrollment of members, after which the minutes of last year's Convention were read and received.

Elder R. L. Woodring gave an address of welcome.

RESOLVED, That all members of the Annual Conference shall be voting members, and all other members present advisory members.

The Convention bar shall occupy the first two pews and

the two amen corners of the church.

Upon request the Chairman appointed Elders W. B. Musselman, C. H. Brunner, and E. T. Shick, a committee to decide which of the Essays, if any, shall be published in the Gospel Banner.

The following Essays were then read, discussed and re-

ceived:

I. An Essay on "The Benefits of Our Reading Course,"

by Elder R. D. Dreisbach.

A preacher of the Gospel shall study.—2 Tim. 2:15. I Tim. 4, tells us to read and meditate. God does not us if we don't study. Christ said, search the Scriptures. Apollos learned of Acquilla and Priscilla. To know divine wisdom we must study, meditate. The Bible has by far the most prominent part in our Reading Course. The action of last Conference recommending a change from Theology to a Book on Bible study, was a wise one. Other books like Thatcher's appeal, showing the tall of man; Nelson on Infidelity, how a man was rescued from infidelity; Philosophy of the Plan of Salvation, showing how God led his people in olden times and led them up to redemption in Christ; Jesus is Coming, which is very practical and Scriptural; Church History, showing how many false doctrines came to be taught

and how the Holy Spirit leads His church; Reformed Pastor gives very practical points on doing pastoral work. The various books of the Reading Course give teaching from redemption from Sin to our presence with the God in glory.

2. "The Relation of our Church to the Widows of our De-

ceased Pastors," by Elder J. G. Shireman.

Acts 6.—Widows were neglected in the daily ministration. Deacons were appointed for their care. This subject how-

ever includes only widows of our Pastors.

These stood by their pastors, having forsaken their positions and suffered with them. Now they are left without support and we can say we pity them, but if we shut our bowels of compassion, how dwelleth the love of God in us.

A good way would be to found an orphanage, make these widows workers or teachers in the Orphanage and have a Spiritual man as Superintendent over them. This would benefit the orphans and would support the widows.

An offering was taken and the forenoon session closed by

prayer by C. H. Branner.

SECOND SESSION, 1.45 P. M.

Opened by singing and prayer by Elder G. A. Campbell. After the roll call the minutes of the forenoon session were read and received.

The questions were answered by Elders W. Steinmetz and

E. T. Shick.

I. An Essay, by Elder G. A. Campbell, cn "The Necessary Qualifications of an Applicant for the Ministry." A call of God and studious habits to study the word are necessary. He needs qualifications of an ambassador in Christ's stead beseeching men to become reconciled to God.

A certain man said, if a man can stay in the home land let him not go to the Foreign field. So with the call to the ministry. Paul said, "Woe is me if I preach not the Gos-

pel."

Aptness to teach and instruct in order to perfect God's people here below is necessary. Illiteracy is no excuse, as Peter and John did much work and people saw God with them. An applicant with too much forwardness and desire of recognition and lack of willingness to teach a class of Sunday School scholars, collect Pastor's salary, etc., should have more humility, patience and judgment. A desire for a fat living is not a quality of God's called ministers.

2. "How to Win Souls and How to Keep Them," by El-

der R. L. Woodring.

The fruit of the righteous is a tree of life and he that wins the souls is wise. Anarchism, powder and dynamite, assails God and his word and all other higher powers and sink people into debauchery and recklessness. If all preachers, bibles, books, were destroyed, there would be after all people who would rise and preach and win souls to Christ. said, "If there be no God it is necessary to invent one." We are to win souls. How shall they preach except they be sent. Christ called base things and filled them with zeal to fish for souls. They cast the net into the waters. Fishermen take great pains and endure perils and so preachers, and they must have the wisdom of God. God calls pastors who feed them on knowledge and wisdom from above. soul panted for the living God. A man who feeds on the word of God will bring forth fruits of the spirit such as love, joy, peace, long suffering, meekness, gentleness, qualities to win and keep souls.

3. An Essay on "The Dangers and Temptations to which the Faithful Preacher of the Present Day is Exposed," by Elder W. G. Gehman.

We are living in the last perilous times; men are lovers of themselves, proud heady, high-minded.

The bread and butter temptation is a great temptation of to-day yet. Paul worked for his support but asked forgiveness for the wrong. Praying night and day and working for the interests of the people and then be criticised, is a great temptation to impatience. There is danger of preaching either too smooth or too rough in order to have applause of man; also danger for a preacher not to be in close fellowship with the Lord. The temptation is to shrink from suffering and take the easy, popular route.

The world lieth in the wicked one, but he that is in us is greater than he that is in the world.

The offering was lifted after which it was

RESOLVED, That we elect the officers for the next Ministerial Convention this afternoon.

Opened by singing and prayer by Elder A. M. Clauser.

The questions were answered by Elders W. B. Musselman and W. J. Fretz.

The Committee on Publications of Essays recommend the publication of the Essays:—"The Relation of the Church to the Widows of our Deceased Pastors," by Elder J. G. Shireman, and "The Dangers and Temptations to which the Faithful Preacher of the Present Day is Exposed," by Elder W. G. Gehman.

The report was received.

The following subject for discussion was opened by Elder W. K. Ziegler.—"The New Birth, Salvation and Glorification."

An offering was lifted for the labor and expenses of the Secretary, amounting to \$3.86. Thanks.

The minutes of the afternoon and evening sessions were read and received.

RESOLVED, That we tender hearty thanks by a rising vote to the members of the Bethlehem class for their kindness and hospitality shown us during this Convention session.

This was followed by an invitation during which several were anointed and healed according to the word of God.

The session was closed by prayer by Elder G. A. Campbell.
