Business Rules of the Conference.

- 1. Two sessions shall be held daily, as follows: From 8 to 11:30 A. M., and from 1 to 5 P. M.
- 2. The Chairman shall take his seat precisely at the time to which the Conference adjourned, open and conduct the devotional exercises. The Secretary shall call the roll, and read the minutes of the preceding session, after which business shall proceed as follows:
- (a) Committee Reports. (b) Petitions. (c) Unfinished Business. (d) Miscellaneous Business.
- 3. Anyone wishing to speak shall arise and respectfully address the Chair. In case more than one should address the Chair at the same time, the Chairman shall decide who is entitled to the floor.
- 4. No one shall be allowed to speak more than ten minutes on any subject unless he receives permission by the Chair.
- 5. No one shall speak the second time until all who desire have spoken. He shall then ask permission of the Chairman.
- 6. It shall be the duty of the Chairman to preserve order.

- 1. Committee on Worship.
- 2. Committee on Communication.
- 3. Committee on Finance.

 - 11. Auditing Committee.

OTHER COMMITTEES.

- 1. Committee on Examination of Probationers on the Reading Course.
 - Committee over the Presiding Elders.
 Poor Committee or Board of Deacons.
 - 4. Stationary, Boundary and Appropriating Committee.

Special Laws and Resolutions.

We print here from the Records for convenient reference the following Laws and Resolutions, together with the time of their enactment:

I.—MEMBERS OF THE ANNUAL CONFERENCE.

A.—The following shall be the members of the Annual Conference:

(a) Ordained Ministers.

(b) Probationers who have charge.

- (c) One Delegate from each charge, elected by ballot at the last Quarterly Conference in the Conference year. [Act of General Conference, 1892.]
- (d) Each Quarterly Conference shall elect one Alternate Delegate to the Annual Conference. [Enacted March 7, 1898.]
- (e) It is requested that all the members of the Annual Conference shall be present at each session. In case of absence they shall submit a written report and cause of absence. [Enacted February 3, 1892.]
- (f) If a Delegate fails to be present at the beginning of the Annual Conference Session, except detained through sickness or accident, the Conference is not bound to recognize him as a member. [Enacted February 3, 1894.]
- (g) The Delegates from the Missions who expect support from the Conference shall not be members of the Stationing, Boundary and Appropriating Committee. [Enacted February 22, 1897.

B.—Advisory Members.

The following shall be Advisory Members of the Annual Conference.

(a) Annual Conference Licensed Evangelists and Missionaries.

- (b) Quarterly Conference Licensed Missionaries.
- (c) Local Workers. [Enacted February 7, 1896.]

II.—APPLICANTS AND PROBATIONERS.

- A.—No applicants for the Ministry shall be received into the Conference as Probationers who are not willing to submit themselves unconditionally to the Stationing Committee or Gospel Herald Society. [Revised October 17, 1903.]
- B.—All applicants for the Ministry shall be examined by their respective Presiding Elders on our Articles of Faith and Church Discipline at the same time and place when the Probationers are examined on the Reading Course. [Enacted February 8, 1893.]
- C.—No Probationer shall be ordained who is not fully in line with our doctrine, with the itinerant plan, and submission to the Conference. [Enacted February 3, 1890.]
- D.—No Probationer in the Ministry or in the office of Deacon shall be ordained who uses or deals in tobacco. They must use their influence against the same. [Enacted February 4, 1885.]

III.—READING COURSE.

- A.—The Annual Lesson for each class shall be divided into two parts, and probationers shall be examined semi-annually. [Enacted February 1, 1895.]
- B.—Probationers shall be examined by a written examination by a committee to be appointed annually by the Annual Conference for this purpose.

They shall make 20 per cent. on each book, and an average of 40 per cent. on the whole, in order to pass. No probationer shall be ordained until he has passed the Reading Course. [Discipline, page 109.]

IV.—SPECIAL SERVICES.

A.—Matrimony.—Each Minister-in-charge shall preach a sermon on Matrimony at each appointment on his charge in

the first year.

B.—Foreign Missions, Harvest Home.—Each Minister-incharge shall continue to hold a Harvest Home Service at each appointment annually, and speak on Foreign Missionary Work. These services shall be held soon after the Annual Conference, and a subscription for Foreign Missions shall be taken on the occasion to be collected before February 1st. [Enacted February 3, 1894.]

NOTE.—The members of our Church shall be respectfully recommended to forward their funds for the Foreign Missionaries through the Foreign Missionary Board and not to the missionaries directly, which would lessen or cause to neglect their contributions in the direct channel provided by Conference for the support pledged to our respective missionaries.

- C.—Missionary Day.—The Minister-in-charge shall see that the Superintendent of each Sunday School appoint a "Missionary Day" annually. In this service the necessity of establishing and supporting Foreign Mission shall be impressed upon the minds of the children, and a collection taken up for the same. [Enacted February 3, 1894.]
- D.—Charity.—The pastor, or somebody appointed by him, shall hold a Special Service at each appointment. On this occasion the Annual Offering for the Poor shall be received. [Enacted February 20, 1897.]
- E.—Missionary Presiding Elder.—Each class shall lift a free will offering for the Missionary Presiding Elder every quarter. [Enacted February 20, 1897.]

Gospel Workers.—A free will offering shall be lifted for the Gospel Workers in each class at a monthly prayer meeting held by their respective class-leaders. [Enacted February 20, 1897.]

- F.—Conference Fund—A collection be lifted once a year in a prayer meeting, in each class by their respective class-leaders for the Conference fund. The pastor in charge shall bring the same to the Annual Conference. [Enacted Oct. 20, 1902.]
- G.—Collections.—The pastor shall have charge of the Offerings for the Poor, Foreign and Home Missionary Work, and Conference Fund, until the annual Conference, unless needed sooner. The Offerings for the Missionary Presiding Elder and Gospel Workers shall be delivered to the Presiding Elder at the Quarterly Conference and reported by the pastor to the Annual Conference.

All moneys collected for charitable purposes, not paid over to the Treasurer of the Poor Fund, shall be included in the report of the Treasurer of the Board of Trustees. [Enacted Feb. 20, 1897.]

H.—The Lord's Coming.—Whereas, We believe that the coming of the Lord is rapidly approaching; therefore

Resolved, That we recommend our Ministers to give still more earnest prominence to this blessed hope of the church as we see the Day approaching. [Enacted February 4, 1894. Amended March 4, 1899.]

- I.—Class Meetings.—The Minister-in-charge shall hold a class meeting four times a year in each year, and read the general rules or get them read once a year. [Discipline, page 80.]
- J.—Camp Meetings.—Camp meetings shall be held annually according to the decisions of the Presiding Elder and pastors of their respective districts.
- K.—Sunday School Conventions.—One or more Sunday School Conventions shall be held annually. The officers shall be elected at the Annual Conference.

V.—QUARTERLY CONFERENCE RULES.

- A.—The Minister-in-charge shall see that the Annual Statistical Report be correctly compiled and appended to the proceedings of the last Quarterly Conference of the current year, as follows:
 - (a) Report of Board of Trustees.

(b) Report of Stewards.

- (c) Report of Presiding Elder's Collections.
 - (d) Report of Sunday School Superintendent.
 - (e) Report of Home and Foreign Mission Collections.
- (f) Report of Annual Election of Officers. Enacted February, 3, 1892.]
- B.—All officers of Quarterly Conference who are absent from Quarterly Conference shall submit a written report and satisfactory excuse. Failing to do this, they shall appear before the next Quarterly Conference. If such are absent the next time without submitting a written report and statement of the cause of absence, they shall be removed from office. [Enacted February 3, 1894.]
- C.—Resolved, That we will not permit any of our Quarterly Conference License Workers to travel as Evangelist, except by permission of the Annual Conference. [Enacted Feb. 22, 1897.]
- D.—The classes shall elect no ministers to any office. [Enacted February 3, 1894.]
- E.—That the Quarterly Conference accounts of the Stewards be from quarter to quarter and the reports on the schedules from annual conference to annual conference. [Enacted Oct. 17,1903.]

VI.—MISCELLANEOUS.

- A.—Tranfers.—When a good standing member moves from one class to another, his or her name shall be transferred at once. [Enacted February 3, 1894.]
- B.—Camp Meetings.—The advisability of having boarding stands at the various camp meetings shall be left to the decision of the Presiding Elders. [Enacted September 17, 1900.]
- C.—Charges.—No charges shall be brought against any Annual Conference Member which have not been recorded in the Quarterly Conference proceedings of their charge, except such as have been committed or discovered since the last Quarterly Conference. [Enacted February 1, 1891.]
- D.—No person shall be elected to the office of Deacon, Class Leader, or Sunday School Superintendent who uses or deals in tobacco. [Enacted February 20, 1897.]
- E.—That all expenses of committees of investigations, appointed by the Presiding Elder, be paid out of the conference fund. [Revised, Oct. 17, 1903.]
- F.—A Board of Foreign Missions consisting of five shall be elected annually. The President shall call and preside over the meetings of the board held annually or oftener. The Secretary shall communicate with the Foreign Missionaries and report to the Annual Conference. The Treasurer shall report the financial standing of the board to the Annual Conference.
- G.—Each pastor shall bring an itemized report to the Conference, according to the form of the report of the Financial Secretary.

FIRST SESSION.

The Twentieth Annual Conference of the Mennonite Brethren in Christ, of the Pennsylvania District, convened in the Ebenezer Mennonite Brethren in Christ Church, Mount Carmel, Pa., at 8 a. m., Oct. 16, 1903.

The first session was opened by singing and a very instructive and heart-searching address on "Kindly Affection With Brotherly Love," Rom. 12, 10, by the chairman, H. B. Musselman, P. E., followed by a season of earnest prayer for the blessing of God and the guidance of the Holy Ghost during this conference session.

Strawn who is charged with disloyalty to the church and Pastor, circulating untruthful reports about the work and Pastor, and sowing dissension among the classes.

The report of the Secretary of the Reading Course Committee was submitted and received. (See Report.)

Whereas, Bro. E. W. Martin has failed to make his per-

centage, we recommend that he take up the same studies for the ensuing year.

Whereas, H. F. Meltzer who passed on the Discipline, T. E. Clewell on the First year course, and M. P. Zook on the Second year course, have not appeared at their respective examinations for some reasons, but now desire to resume their studies, therefore,

Resolved, That we recommend the Conference to grant their desire.

W. G. Gehman, R. D. Dreisbach, Committee.

Resolved. That the Candidates for Ordination, J. C. Roth, and W. S. Hottel, be referred to the Committee on Ordination.

Mr. Chas. D. Martz, Secretary of the Y. M. C. A., of Mt. Carmel, Pa., Misses A. C. Spellman, S. J. Haupt, A. W. Smith and L. M. Musselman, of the Gospel Worker Society, were introduced to the Conference.

The oral reports of the pastors were continued.

The reports were encouraging. The work in general appears prosperous, in numbers and spirituality. A marked feature is the missionary spirit manifested in all the classes.

Resolved, That the Missionary Presiding Elders and the Presiding Elder of the church give their oral reports.

C. H. BRUNNER, Missionary Presiding Elder of the Gospel Herald Society, reported severe tests, had the more blessed victories. Many were converted and baptized right along. One worker died on the battle field.

The finances were better than ever before. New missions were opened at Philadelphia and Stroudsburg. The mission at Philipsburg is ready to be turned over to the church. We wish to gratefully acknowledge the liberal appropriations received from the last Annual Conference.

W. B. Musselman, Missionary Presiding Elder of the Gospel Worker Society, gave a very spicy and interesting report. At present they have more than a dozen applicants for the work. They had more converts this summer than ever before. Finances are on the increase. The colportage work is marvelous. They expect to print about 2500 Gospel Worker calenders this year. Many of their newly published G. W. S. S. Heralds are being sold. The Lord leads wondrously.

H. B. Musselman, Presiding Elder, reported the ministry more united in love than ever before. Small hindrances existing for years have been wiped out. Many tent meetings were held with blessed results. Camp Meetings were large gatherings with glorious spiritual results. The officers in the church are loyal and stand by their different pastors.

The financial reports of the Presiding Elders were submitted and received. (See Reports.)

Closed by prayer by W. Steinmetz.

Third Session, Friday Evening, October 16, 1903.

Opened by singing and prayer by L. B. Taylor, after which the minutes of the previous session were read and received with corrections.

The following committee reports were submitted and received.

Auditing Committee.—We have audited all the books and accounts and found them all correct except the Conference Schedules of Coopersburg, Gratersford and Harleysville, Nazareth and Plainfield. We also found a slight mistake in the Northampton Camp meeting accounts which we corrected. We found mistakes in the Coopersburg and Reading Quarterly Conference summary accounts. We found no Quarterly Conference summary in the Nazareth and Plainfield Quarterly Conference minute book, consequently could not audit it.

The report of the Treasurer of the Beneficiary Fund was submitted and received. (See Report.)

Resolved, That E. R. Heywood whose ordination has been postponed be referred to the Committee on Ordination.

Resolved, That the Conference resolve itself into a committee of the whole, except F. L. Zimmerman and W. W. Zimmerman, to consider the Home Missionary Work. Adjourned for the Committee of the whole to meet.

Fourth Session, Saturday Afternoon, Oct. 17, 1903.

Opened by singing and prayer by E. W. Martin, after which the minutes of the previous session were read and received.

The following committee reports were submitted and received.

Committee on Communications.—We have read the letter of A. M. Clauser, of Groveland, Ill., and recommend to have it read to this Conference.

E. N. Cassel, Wm. Gehman, W. Steinmetz,

The letters of our Foreign Missionaries, and A. M. Clausser, of Groveland, Ill., were read and referred to the Committee on Resolutions.

The report of Sister Rose Lambert came too late for Conference.

Resolved, That the Treasurer of Conference Fund pay the expenses of the committees which served during the past year.

The report of the Committee of the Whole was submitted and received.

Resolved, That W. G. Gehman read the essay which he had read before the Ministerial Convention, on "The Relation of Our Church to the Home Missionary Society."

Resolved, That a committee of seven be elected to form articles of mutual agreement, between the Gospel Herald Society and the church proper, which articles shall be submitted to the Gospel Herald Society for each one of them to sign.

Resolved, That W. B. Musselman, C. H. Brunner, H. B. Musselman and W. G. Gehman be four of these men, the last three each to appoint another man. E. N. Cassel, J. G. Shireman and R. L. Woodring were appointed.

WHEREAS, W. W. Zimmerman has proven himself incapable financially showing a lack of ability to do pastoral work, therefore

Resolved, That this committee recommend the conference not to give him a charge for the present.

Resolved, That we appreciate the publishing of the Gospel Worker Society Herald, and deem it the proper paper in every particular, for its intended mission.

Whereas, Charges have been brought against E. R Heywood, therefore

Resolved, That these charges be referred to the Committee on Examination of applicants for ordination.

Whereas, A. Strawn is charged with disloyalty to church and pastor, circulating untruthful reports about the work and pastor, sowing dissension among the classes, which charges have been sustained against him, therefore

Resolved, That we expel him.

The report of the sub committee of seven, on the articles of mutual agreement between the Mennonite Brethren in Christ Conference, and the Gospel Herald Society, was submitted and received.

The report of the Board of Trustees of the Norristown Church was submitted and received.

Resolved, That the Presiding Elder, A. A. Wismer and A. M. Gehman be re-elected as a Board of Trustees of the Norristown Church.

Resolved, That we erase Standing rule, Page 8, E. Insert the following: That all expenses of committees of investigation, appointed by the Presiding Elder, be paid out of the Conference Fund.

Resolved, That the Editor of the Conference Journal arrange a brief report of next Sunday's services to be published in the Conference Journal.

Resolved, That the minutes be published only in the Conference Journal, and that a supplement be sent to the sub-

scribers of the "Banner," of the other Conferences, to be paid for out of the Conference Fund.

Resolved, That the Presiding Elder of the church proper buy the tabernacle, and a tent to live in, and that the secretary assist him in apportioning the amount according to membership, for the pastors to collect.

A collection was lifted for the labor and expenses of the Secretary, amounting to \$6.26. Thanks.

PROCEEDINGS

OF THE

Fourteenth Annual Ministerial Convention.

The Fourteenth Annual Ministerial Convention of the Mennonite Brethren in Christ of the Pennsylvania Conference convened in the Ebenezer Church, Fourth street, Mt. Carmel, Pa., on Oct. 15, 1903.

The Chairman Elder E. N. Cassel opened the Convention at 9 a. m. by singing and prayer, followed by the enrollment of members, after which the minutes of last years Convention were read and received.

Elder R. L. Woodring gave an address of welcome.

Resolved, That all members of the Annual Conference be voting members and all other members present advisory members.

That the Convention bar consists of the first three pews through the church and the Amen corner on the men's side.

Upon request the Chair appointed Elders, H. B. Musselman, C. H. Brunner and O. S. Hillegass a committee to decide which of the essays, if any, shall be published in the Gospel Banner.

The following essays were then read, discussed and received.

"The Relation of Our Church to the Home Missionary Society," by Elder W. G. Gehman.

That there should be a connecting link between our Church and the Home Missionary Society, is implied by the subject.

It is manifest that unless there is confidence of either one in the other, the Lord's expectations are hampered.

There ought to be some rules and regulations between the two bodies mutually agreed upon, and made out by the president of the Society and the Presiding Elder of the Church with support of the rest connected with either body.

The Society might occasionally call the Church to hold conventions at missions to be turned over to the Church, a considerable length of time beforehand, to get the mission members acquainted with the Church, and vice versa. The Church should not urge the young men to marry to qualify them as pastors, for they may be pastors without the wife making them so, if they be called to God for such work. While some who marry may never become pastors. The Society should not urge them to remain single in order to retain them as Missionaries, for married men might possibly be used in the Home Missionary Society.

"The Pastor and His Relation to His Flock," by Elder E. T. Shick. The pastor is one who has charge of a Church or congregation whose duty it is to watch over and instruct them. Paul said in Rom. 10-15., and how shall they preach except they be sent. A divine commission is of the greatest importance to any one that will labor for the Master, if he is called, he is called forever. A pastor is as closely related to his flock as to his own family, and will suffer and die for them.

Resolved, That we elect officers for the next Ministerial Convention.

The following were elected: J. G. Shireman, Chairman, and E. T. Shick, Secretary. Committee to arrange program: W. G. Gehman, H. B. Musselman and L. F. Haas.

Resolved, That the next Ministerial Convention be held a day prior to the next Annual Conference and at the same place.

The forenoon session closed by prayer by W. J. Fretz.

Second Session, 1.30 p. m.

Opened by singing and prayer by Elder William Gehman.

After the roll call the minutes of the forenoon session were read and received.

A discussion, "The Advisability of Having Two Presiding Elders," was opened by Elder G. A. Campbell.

An essay by Elder J. G. Shireman. "The Advisability of Having Orphanages and Homes."

The Apostles no doubt preached that it was necessary for those that had too much should share, not be selfish, but give to the poorer class and have all things common.

The time has come for us to have an orphanage and home. The subject was one of great interest and recommended to the Conference for consideration.

An essay by Elder W. J. Fretz, "Present Day Dangers and Temptations for Pastors." One of the dangers for pastors is to preach smooth in order to have the respect of the world, and seek favor of rich men. The bread and butter temptation also is a great one. Another is to become heady and have no respect for their superiors, some are even tempted to preach Mackintosh, Spurgeon, Moody, Simpson and others. We should preach the word of God.

The afternoon session closed by prayer by G. A. Campbell.

Evening Session, 7.00 p. m.

Opened by singing and prayer by Elder J. G. Shireman. After roll call, the reading of the minutes of the afternoon session. The questions were answered by Elders R. D. Dreisbach and J. C. Roth.

An essay by R. Bergstresser, "Camp Meetings, and How to Conduct Them."

A camp meeting should be conducted by the Presiding Elder or one appointed by him who is very spiritual and should be for no other purpose than for the salvation of souls. Camp meetings of last year were conducted in a very good manner by our Presiding Elder. A volume of voices arose in praise to God for the noble work done.

An essay by Elder R. L. Woodring, "An Outline of Bible Doctrine." Salvation by faith in Lord Jesus Christ is our standard.
