

Business Rules of the Conference.

- I. Two sessions shall be held daily, as follows: From 8 to II:30 a.m., and from I to 5 p. m.
- 2. The Chairman shall take his seat precisely at the time to which the Conference adjourned, open and conduct the devotional exercises. The Secretary shall call the roll, and read the minutes of the preceding session, after which business shall proceed as follows:
- (a) Committee Reports. (b) Petitions. (c) Unfinished Business. (d) Miscellaneous Business.
- 3. Anyone wishing to speak shall arise and respectfully address the Chair. In case more than one should address the Chair at the same time, the Chairman shall decide who is entitled to the floor.
- 4. No one shall be allowed to speak more than ten minutes on any subject unless he receives permission by the Chair.
- 5. No one shall speak the second time until all who desire have spoken. He shall then ask permission of the Chairman.
 - 6. It shall be the duty of the Chairman to preserve order.

 - 10. Committee on Resolutions.
 - 11. Auditing Committee.

OTHER COMMITTEES.

- 1. Committee on Examination of Probationers on the Reading Course.
 - 2. Committee over the Presiding Elders.
 - 3. Poor Committee or Board of Deacons.
 - 4. Stationary, Boundary and Appropriating Committee.
 - 5. Foreign Mission Board.

Special Laws and Resolutions.

We print here from the Records for convenient reference the following Laws and Regulations, together with the time of their enactment.

I.—MEMBERS OF THE ANNUAL CONFERENCE.

A.—The following shall be the members of the Annual Conference:

- (a) Ordained Ministers.
- (b) Probationers who have charge.
- (c) One delegate from each charge, elected by ballot at the last Quarterly Conference in the Conference year. [Act of General Conference, 1892.]
- (d) Each Quarterly Conference shall elect one Alternate Delegate to the Annual Conference. [Enacted March 7, 1898.]
- (e) It is requested that all the members of the Annual Conference shall be present at each session. In case of absence they shall submit a written report and cause of absence. [Enacted February 3, 1892.]
- (f) If a delegate fails to be present at the beginning of the Annual Conference Session, except detained through sickness or accident, the Conference is not bound to recognize him as a member. [Enacted February 3, 1894.]
- (g) The Delegates from the Missions who expect support from the Conference shall not be members of the Stationing, Boundary and Appropriating Committee. [Enacted February 22, 1897.]

B.—Advisory Members.

The following shall be Advisory Members of the Annual Conference.

(a) Annual Conference Licensed Evangelists and Missionaries.

- (b) Quarterly Conference Licensed Missionaries.
- (c) Local Workers. [Enacted February 7, 1896.]

II.—APPLICANTS AND PROBATIONERS.

- A.—No applicants for the Ministry shall be received into the Conference as Probationers who are not willing to submit themselves unconditionally to the Stationing Committee or Gospel Herald Society. [Revised October 17, 1903.]
- B.—All applicants for the Ministry shall be examined by their respective Presiding Elders on our Articles of Faith and Church Discipline at the same time and place when the Probationers are examined on the Reading Course. [Enacted February 8, 1893.]
- C.—No Probationer shall be ordained who is not fully in line with our doctrine, with the itinerant plant, and submission to the Conference. [Enacted February 3, 1890.]
- D.—No Probationer in the Ministry or in the office of Deacon shall be ordained who uses or deals in tobacco. They must use their influence against the same. [Enacted February 4, 1885.]

III.—READING COURSE.

- A.—The Annual Lesson for each class shall be divided into two parts, and probationers shall be examined semi-annually. [Enacted February 1, 1895.]
- B.—Probationers shall be examined by a written examination by a committee to be appointed annually by the Annual Conference for this purpose.

They shall make 20 per cent. on each book, and an average of 40 per cent. on the whole, in order to pass. No probationer shall be ordained until he has passed on the Reading Course. [Discipline, page 109.]

IV.—SPECIAL SERVICES.

- A.—Matrimony.—Each Minister-in-charge shall preach a sermon on Matrimony at each appointment on his charge in the first year.
- B.—Foreign Missions, Harvest Home.—Each Minister-incharge shall continue to hold a Harvest Home Service at each appointment annually, and speak on Foreign Missionary Work. These services shall be held soon after the Annual Conference, and a subscription for Foreign Missions shall be taken on the occasion to be collected before February 1st. [Enacted February 3, 1894.]

NOTE—The members of our Church shall be respectfully recommended to forward their funds for the Foreign Missionaries through the Foreign Missionary Board and not to the missionaries directly, which would lessen or cause to neglect their contributions in the direct channel provided by Conference for the support pledged to our respective missionaries.

C.—Missionary Day.—The Minister-in-charge shall see that the Superintendent of each Sunday School appoint a "Missionary Day" annually. In this service the necessity of establishing and supporting Foreign Missions shall be impressed upon the minds of the children, and a collection taken up for the same. [Enacted February 3, 1894.]

D.—Charity.—The pastor, or somebody appointed by him, shall hold a Special Service at each appointment. On this occasion the Annual offering for the Poor shall be received. [Enacted February 20, 1897.]

E.—Missionary Presiding Elder.—Each class shall lift a free will offering for the Missionary Presiding Elder every quarter. [Enacted February 20, 1897.]

Gospel Workers.—A free will offering shall be lifted for the Gospel Workers in each class at a monthly prayer meeting held by their respective class-leaders. [Enacted February 20, 1897.]

F.—Conference Fund.—A collection be lifted once a year in a prayer meeting, in each class by their respective class-leaders for the conference fund. The pastor in charge shall bring the same to the annual conference. [Enacted October 20, 1902.]

G.—Collections.—The pastor shall have charge of the offerings for the poor, foreign and home missionary work, and conference fund, until the annual conference, unless needed sooner. The offerings for the Missionary Presiding Elder and Gospel Workers shall be delivered to the Presiding Elder at the quarterly conference and reported by the pastor to the annual conference.

All moneys collected for charitable purposes, not paid over to the treasurer of the poor fund, shall be included in the report of the Treasurer of the Board of Trustees. [Enacted February 20, 1897.]

H.—All collections received on a charge for the building or purchase of churches, parsonages, or other purposes on another charge shall be reported by the pastor where collected.

I.—The Lord's Coming.—Believing that the coming of the Lord is rapidly approaching; therefore we recommend our ministers to give still more earnest prominence to this blessed hope of the church as we see the Day approaching. [Enacted February 4, 1894. Amended March 4, 1899.]

J.—As the Scriptures contain a number of instances where children of Godly parents were formally and publicly dedicated to the Lord, (I Sam. 22-28; Mark 10, 13-16,) we heartily encourage our people to dedicate their children to the Lord by prayer and laying on of the hands of Elders, who shall then furnish proper certificates. [Enacted Oct. 28, 1904.]

K.—Class Meetings.—The Minister-in-charge shall hold a class meeting four times a year in each year, and read the general rules or get them read once a year. [Discipline, page 80.]

L.—Camp Meetings.—Camp meetings shall be held annually according to the decisions of the Presiding Elder and pastors of their respective districts.

M.—Sunday School Conventions.—One or more Sunday School Conventions shall be held annually. The officers shall be elected at the annual conference.

The committee on programme shall meet six weeks before the convention to arrange a programme.

Each Sunday School shall be represented by the Superintendent, and one delegate from the laity.

The superintendents, delegates and essayists shall have their fares paid.

Each superintendent shall take up a liberal collection to defray the expenses of the convention. [Enacted Oct. 29, 1904.]

N.—In case there is more collected at a camp-meeting than is needed to pay all expenses, the balance shall be paid to the treasurer of the Annual Conference who shall hold it as an equipment fund to be used to buy equipments for camp meeting, such as tabernacles, lamps, etc., as may be needed from time to time according to the decision of the Presiding Elder and the camp meeting committees.

V.—QUARTERLY CONFERENCE RULES.

A.—The Minister-in-charge shall see that the Annual Statistical Report be correctly compiled and appended to the proceedings of the last Quarterly Conference of the current year, as follows:

- (a) Report of Board of Trustees.
- (b) Report of Stewards.
- (c) Report of Presiding Elder's Collections.
- (d) Report of Sunday School Superintendent.
- (e) Report of Home and Foreign Mission Collections.
- (f) Report of Annual Election of Officers. [Enacted February 3, 1892.]

B.—All officers of Quarterly Conference who are absent from Quarterly Conference shall submit a written report and satisfactory excuse. Failing to do this, they shall appear before the next Quarterly Conference. If such are absent the next time without submitting a written report and statement of the cause of absence, they shall be removed from office. [Enacted February 3, 1894.]

C.—We will not permit any of our Quarterly Conference License Workers to travel as Evangelist, except by permission of the Annual Conference. [Enacted February 22, 1897.]

D.—The classes shall elect no ministers to any office. [Enacted February 3, 1894.]

E.—The class leaders and stewards shall be elected shortly before and their term of office begin immediately after the last quarterly conference.

F.—The Quarterly Conference accounts of Stewards be from quarter to quarter, and the reports on the schedules from October I to October I. In case a pastor is changed his allowances shall end with the month of September. [Enacter Oct. 28, 1904.]

VI.—MISCELLANEOUS.

A.—Transfers.—When a good standing member moves from one class to another, his or her name shall be transferred at once. [Enacted February 3, 1894.]

B.—Camp Meetings.—The advisability of having boarding stands at the various camp meetings shall be left to the decision of the Presiding Elders. [Enacted September 17, 1900.]

C.—Charges.—No charges shall be brought against any Annual Conference member which have not been recorded in the Quarterly Conference proceedings of their charge, except such as have been committed or discovered since the last Quarterly Conference. [Enacted February 1, 1891.]

D.—No person shall be elected to the office of Deacon, Class Leader, or Sunday School Superintendent who uses or deals in tobacco. [Enacted February 20, 1897.]

E.—All expenses of committees of investigation, appointed by the Presiding Elder, shall be paid out of the conference fund. [Revised October 17, 1903.]

F.—A Board of Foreign Missions consisting of five shall be elected annually. The President shall call and preside over the meetings of the board held annually or oftener. The Secretary shall communicate with the Foreign Missionaries and report to the Annual Conference. The Treasurer shall report the financial standing of the board to the Annual Conference.

G.—Each pastor shall bring an itemized report to the Conference, according to the form of the report of the Financial Secretary.

H.—We recommend each pastor to make special efforts to swell the Beneficiary Fund to assist the worthy widows of the deceased pastors. [Enacted October 29, 1904.]

I.—We recommend our ministers not to officiate at Sunday funerals, and use their influence strongly against the same. [Enacted October 29, 1904.]

J.—The minutes be published only in the Conference Journal, and that the Secretary be priveleged to curtail them as he sees fit and order a supplement printed to be sent to the subscribers of the "Banner," of the other conferences, to be paid for out of the conference fund.

K.—The editor of the Conference Journal shall arrange a brief report of the Sunday services to be published in the Conference Journal.

L.—The Treasurer of the Home and Foreign Funds shall be authorized to loan money without interest out of these funds to the M. P. E. of the Gospel Worker Society, according to the judgment of the Treasurer and Presiding Elders.

Whenever the Gospel Worker Society turns one or more missions over to the Church, a committee, consisting of Presiding Elders, Treasurer and Missionary Presiding Elder, shall appraise the personal property or real estate belonging to said mission. In case the Church chooses to buy the same, paying the same, paying the same out of the Home Mission treasury.

FIRST SESSION.

The Twenty-second Annual Conference of the Mennonite Brethren in Christ, of the Pennsylvania District, convened in the Ebenezer Mennonite Brethren in Christ Church, Bethlehem, Pa., 8 a.m., October 12, 1905.

The first session was opened by singing and a very instructive and impressive address on "The Unity of the Brethren," Psalm 133, by the chairman, H. B. Musselman, P. E., followed by a season of earnest prayer for the blessing of God and the guidance of the Holy Ghost during this conference session.

The reports show zeal on the part of the pastors which bore fruit numerically, financially and spiritually on their respective charges.

The Sunday School work is grand. There are new open doors

for mission work right on the several fields of labor.

Souls were saved and baptized during the year. Open air work is one special feature of the work. Missionary offerings, both Home and Foreign, were large.

Resolved, That the Missionary Presiding Elders and the Presiding Elder of the Church give their oral reports.

C. H. Brunner, M. P. E., of the Gospel Herald Society, reported many converted during the year, also a number baptized.

Quite a number have been marvelously healed by the Lord.

Open air services are very interesting and well attended in Pottstown and Norristown especially. About \$4000.00 worth of literature was sold by the Heralds last year. The G. W. S. Herald sells excellently. A number of tent meetings held resulted in a number saved. A hall was opened in Pottstown with a number of good standbys. We have a few very good Sunday Schools that are interested in Foreign Missionary work, and offered through the barrels about \$50.00.

One of the Heralds soon leaves for the Foreign Field. The workers are well united and loyal, willing to work and sacrifice.

H. B. Musselman, P. E., reported the ministry well united. The work is quite large and means especial work on the part of the pastors. A few very good tabernacle meetings were held. The three Camp Meetings were very large and the attendance was very good. The work has been well established and the weaker classes were encouraged. At these Camp Meetings a number of souls were saved and others were cut loose. Some confessed their wrong and received victory.

A number of parsonages have been paid off and all these are in a good condition. The people on every charge are standing by and sacrifice for the work. The brethren in the ministry will stand by any man who may be put in as leader.

W. B. Musselman, M. P. E., and Editor and Publisher of the G. W. S. Herald, reported less halls and few more workers. They have fifty-two workers at present. Halls are hard to rent. Only 3800 meetings were held in halls, but more evangelistic work was done. 16,000 visits were made last year where the workers prayed. 3200 open air meetings were held, during fairs or shows often, in various towns where subscribers for the G. W. S. Herald were solicited. 8100 G. W. S. Heralds are published per week. They expect to have 10,000 by another

year. They receive many encouraging reports from readers of the G. W. S. Herald.

Our stock of supplies is getting larger right along.

They had more conversions during the summer than ever before. The workers are learning to know that the work depends on them.

Resolved, That the Conference meet in a Committee of the Whole, at 7 p.m., to consider the letter of E. W. Martin, T. E. Clewell, who is under charges, the number of Presiding Elders, the Mission work, and the Orphanage work.

The reports of the Treasurers of the Sunday School Conventions of the Schuylkill Valley and Lehigh Valley Districts were respectively submitted and received. (See reports.)

The report of the Treasurer of the Board of Deacons was submitted and received. (See report.)

The report of the Treasurer of the Conference Fund was submitted and received. (See report.)

R. W. Zoller and P. J. Musselman, of the Gospel Herald Society, were recommended to the Conference as applicants for Annual Conference Licenses.

The financial reports of the Missionary Presiding Elder of the Gospel Herald Society and of the Presiding Elder of the Church, were respectively submitted and received. (See Reports.)

The financial report of the Treasurer of the Beneficiary Society was submitted and received. (See Report.)

The reports of the Treasurer of the Board of Foreign and Home Missions were submitted and received. (See Reports.)

Report of Secretary of Board of the Foreign Missions For the Conference Year Ending October 12, 1905.

CHILI, S. A.

H. L. Weiss and Mrs. H. L. Weiss, of Valdivia, left Chili in January and arrived in New York in February on furlough. They have visited the Church appointments and Camp Meetings where their presence was appreciated. They have also been busy traveling through the West to Kansas and Nebraska. They expect to sail for Chili the beginning of No-

vember. M. P. Zook, under appointment, will sail with them. H. L. Weiss has charge of 14 Foreign Missionaries and 8 Spanish workers and a field of seven circuits extending over 300 miles or more.

The missions are being well established.

Likely over 100 were baptized during the present year. The whole membership last year was 570. They publish 4000 small Spanish papers, distributed by the Missionaries and through the mail. We support 8 missionaries in Chili.

A. E. Dawson has charge of the financial affairs during the absence of H. L. Weiss. He is also in charge of the work at La Union and Rio Bueno. He baptized several. Many tracts

were distributed and many books sold.

Mrs. A. E. Dawson is studying language and spending much

time in prayer.

Neils Gunstad and Mrs. Neils Gunstadt live at Valdivia, where he has charge of the work and also teaches a school. Here they have over 100 members. A number were baptized. They are perfecting the language.

H. W. Feldges is in charge of the Spanish work in Temuco, and oversees the German work in that section, visiting the German appointments once a month. The Germans like him

well. He has a fair knowledge of the language.

David Mancilla is stationed at Osorno, where quite a number were saved and baptized.

LANCHEO, CHINA.

C. F. Snyder's field has few encouragements, but the Lord. His health is perfect. He is satisfied. He took a two months' trip to see about opening a station at Kueiteh, and distributed

gospels and tracts and preached along the way.

He with three others were set apart for Thibetan work at their last Conference. He is the Secretary of the Executive Committee. Missionary work in Kansuh province among the Mohammedans is very slow. Among few others, two intellectual, literary men, of the degree B. A., were gloriously saved and often walk four miles to hear the Gospel. Many more inquirers now. The time of ingathering of Chinese has come. The Thibetans visit him much. God is giving him the language. He makes a strong plea for young men especially.

HADJIN, TURKEY, ASIA.

Miss Rose Lambert left her field in May and came to New York in June on furlough. She visited our Camp Meeting, presenting the needs of Hadjin Orphanage and Armenian work impressively. She travels through the West at present.

They have over 300 orphans in their home. Their health is well preserved. She does some nursing beside the work in the Orphanage. Much work left undone for lack of workers.

PROCEEDINGS

OF THE

Sixteenth Annual Ministerial Convention.

Proceedings of the Sixteenth Annual Ministerial Convention. The Sixteenth Annual Ministerial Convention of the Mennonite Brethren in Christ Church, of the Pennsylvania Conference convened in the Ebenezer Church, Laurel Street, Bethlehem, Pa., October 11, 1905.

The Chairman, J. C. Roth, opened the Convention at 9 a.m., with singing and prayer, followed by the roll call, after which the minutes of the previous Annual Ministerial Convention were read and received with few corrections.

Resolved, That the Convention bar consist of the two first pews through the church and the two amen corners.

Resolved, That all Annual Conference members be voting members and all workers present advisory members of this Convention.

Resolved, That no speaker be allowed to speak more than ten minutes and only once, except by permission of the Chairman.

Resolved, That the Chair appoint a Time-keeper and Reporter. He appointed J. F. Barrall and R. L. Woodring respectively.

Resolved, That we have a Committee on Publication, the same to be appointed by the chairman.

He appointed H. B. Musselman, Geo. A. Campbell and R. Bergstresser.

The following essays were then read, discussed and received. First.—"Christian Courtesy to be shown among the Ministry," by E. T. Shick. Courtesy, Webster says, is politeness of manner, especially politeness connected with kindness. There is no doubt a first cause why so little courtesy is manifest in the ministry.

With many it may only be a careless and indifferent spirit, while with others it is envy or jealousy, and to treat them kindly would perhaps cause them to rank above ourselves, and such a thought would cause a lot of discomfort. Courtesy to be shown to young pastors. Young pastors who may not be able to interest their congregation as some others and yet say some good things, and when they speak at Camp Meeting then to see an old pastor study his Bible or look around so he does not need to hear what is being said, and some pastors do all their Amening when their man speaks or some one speaks that they can get rattled or excitable.

There should be special kindness shown to the young pastors if they are expected to show kindness to others.

Resolved, That a committee of three be appointed by the Chairman to investigate the cause of some pastors being tardy at the morning session, and that they have power to reprimand with courtesy said pastors if necessary. And that said committee bring in their report at the afternoon session. W. G. Gehman, H. B. Musselman and E. N. Cassel were appointed.

Resolved, That all delegates be left over to above committee.

Second.—"Tact in Pastoral Work outside of the Pulpit," by W. S. Hottel. This subject contains two main thoughts. First, The Pastor's work outside of the Pulpit; Second, The Pastor's tact in performing said work. Among one of the many gifts bestowed upon the Church through the gift of the spirit, is the gift of the Pastor, Eph. 4:7, 12. His work is manifold and diversified. It is set forth under various figures throughout the scriptures: A Sower, Psa. 126:6; A fisher of Men, Matt. 4:19; A Watchman, Heb. 13:17; A Builder, I Cor. 3:10; A Steward, I Cor. 4:1; A Shepherd, I Peter, 5: 2, 4.

Resolved, That the motion of receiving the essay be laid on the table until the afternoon session.

Resolved, That a collection be lifted to defray the expenses of this Convention, printing of programmes, etc.

After which the session closed with the Benediction by H. B. Musselman.

Second Session, 1.45 p. m.

Opened by singing and prayer by L. Frank Haas. Followed by roll call, after which the minutes of the morning session were read and received.

Report of the Committee on Tardiness:

WHEREAS, A few of the ministering brethren arrived about an hour late, thereby causing somewhat of a disturbance in the Convention, therefore

Resolved, That we express our deepest sorrow and regret for their tardiness, and upon their earnest plea for mercy, recommend this Convention to forgive them, and that the Chairman welcome them in a courteous manner by a hearty hand shake, to a place in the Convention bar.

AND WHEREAS, A number of our Annual Conference Delegates were present at this Convention in good time, therefore

Resolved, That we appreciate their interest shown in the work very much and also express our deepest sorrow for those who were not present. Committee, W. G. Gehman, H. B. Musselman and E. N. Cassel.

The essay that was laid on the table at the forenoon session was then taken up, further discussed and received.

First.—"Dangerous Characters among Christians, according to God's Word," by J. C. Roth.

This subject implies that there are Christians according to God's Word and that according to the same Word there are dangerous characters among them. Some of the dangerous Characters are, first, Heretics, second, Disloyal, third, Jealous, fourth, Treacherous, fifth, Sowers of Dissension, and last of all are the most dangerous and these are the Dishonest Ones.

An offering was lifted for the labor and expense of the Secretary, amounting to \$4.54. (Thanks.)

Second.—"Suggestions and Plans concerning our Orphanage," by W. G. Gehman.

The inspired essays and discussions at previous Conventions, the Conference electing a Committee on Orphanage, investing them with the power to buy a place, which power they exercised and bought a farm of eighty-five acres of fertile soil, good buildings and many other favorable features, situated near the Allentown and Philadelphia Traction line and still nearer to the P. & R. R. Station at Centre Valley, Pa.

Concerning this home for orphans some plans and suggestions were given. First, The Temporal Economy; Second, Spiritual Economy; Third, Trades Economy.

Resolved, That we hold another Ministerial Convention, to be held a day prior to the next Annual Conference and at the same place.

The following officers were elected: J. F. Barrall, Chairman; R. Bergstresser, Secretary.

Committee to Arrange Programme: W. G. Gehman, H. B. Musselman and C. H. Brunner.

The questions were answered by H. B. Musselman and Geo. A. Campbell. After which the session closed with the Benediction by Geo. A. Campbell.

Third Session, 7.15 p. m.

Opened with singing and prayer by W. S. Hottel. After the roll was called, the minutes of the afternoon session read and received.

The following essays were then read, discussed and received: First.—"Justification as Taught by the Word of God," by E. N. Cassel.

By Justification, that is in the sense that we now want to examine it, that is theological, we understand the judicial or gracious act of God by which the sinner is declared righteous or justly free from obligation to penalty and fully restored to divine favor. It is the absolution of a sinner from the guilt of sin and death.

Second.—"Sanctification as set forth in God's Word," by C. H. Brunner. The term is applied in Scriptures, First, To Days; Second, To Annuals; Third, To Places; Fourth, To Worship.

Report of the Committee on Publication: We, the following committee, herewith recommend the essay on "Sanctification, as set forth in God's Word," by C. H. Brunner, to be published in pamphlet form.

Resolved That we tender a rising vote of thanks to the members of the Bethlehem class for their kindness and hospitality shown us during this Convention.

Resolved, That the minutes be printed in the Conference Journal.

Resolved, That the Secretary send a report of this Convention to the Gospel Banner for publication.

Resolved, That the matter of publishing the essay, "Sanctification, as set forth in God's Word," be referred to the Annual Conference.
